Career Plan by Wally (Dilbert)

- Avoid work where individual accomplishments are measured
- Hoard knowledge of legacy system to be indispensable
- Within 4 years of retiring, only work on projects with 5-year payback







PM Still in Infancy ... and Accelerating

- ▶ 1910-1920: Scientific management
- ▶ Europe: mid-1940s civic reconstruction
- ▶ US: 1950s defense and large corporations
- ▶ 1969: PMI founded
- ▶ 2016: PMI: global market of 52M PMs


Trend #1: PMO 3.0

- More controlling and directing role






More Effective PMO Structures

Trend #2: Ethical PM

- Lapses in ethics have given us, e.g.:
 - Fnron
 - Peregrine Systems
 - Enron-by-the-sea
 - Sub-prime mortgage crisis
- Some projects just move too fast
- Difficult to admit error





Project-Specific Challenges

- Need for blame
- Violation of standards, regulatory issues
- ▶ Biases
- Violation of HR policy, worker rights
- "Cooking" the project books
- Temporary nature of projects and team relationships

More Focus on Sustainability

- > Smart businesses understand value of PM:
 - Lower costs, increased efficiency
 - Improved customer and stakeholder satisfaction
 - Greater competitive advantage
- Sustainable organizations will increase these advantages by embedded PM and PMOs





Changing Role of Standards & Values



- > Standards important to new practitioners
- > Standards become reinforcing
- Executives most value:
 - Leadership
 - Complex problem solving, open ended & ambiguous
 - Familiarity with business environment
- ▶ PMs need more leadership skills
- New roles: PMO, CPO

What are the Professions?

- Medieval times: Divinity, Medicine, Law
- ▶ US By 1900
 - Surveying, medicine, actuarial science, law, dentistry, civil engineering, logistics, architecture, accounting pharmacy, veterinary medicine, psychology, nursing, teaching, librarianship, optometry, social work





Milestones of a Profession

- an occupation is full-time
- establishment of a training school
- establishment of a university school
- establishment of a local association
- establishment of a national association
- > codes of professional ethics introduced
- establishment of state licensing laws





How Does PM Stack Up?

- Full time occupation;
- University degrees (accredited by PMI GAC), adult education programs;
- Local Chapters + global organization;
- Code of Ethics and Professional Conduct;
- Some countries considering licensure; US has related licenses (e.g. LPA, PE)





Strategy or Commodity? You Decide

- Commodity
 - Perceived as "core competency"
 - Skills required by all business leaders
 - Pay rates declining
- Strategy
 - Mission critical projects, recover failed initiatives, and deliver corporate change
 - Organizations struggle to attract senior skills, settle for intermediate

Some Things Will Never Change

- Need for both technical and soft skills
- Ability to manage change
- Communicate, communicate, communicate
- Management by influence, not authority





Core Values and Core Deliverables

- You must possess these to ensure high deliverable teams:
 - Ownership overarching operational value
 - Integrity most important personal core value
 - Healthy organizations have one formal leader
 - No fear of external change factors: embrace and leverage





8 Step Roadmap to Success

- 1) Become a <u>lifelong learner</u>; <u>Join</u> PMI; Be a <u>volunteer</u>
 - 2) Become PMP certified (CAPM or PMP)
 - 3) Advocate organization-wide PMI membership
 - 4) Increase number of certified PMs in your organization
 - 5) Advocate PMBOK® Guide framework, implement best practices
 - 6) Assess organization's PM environment with OPM3
 - 7) Advocate **PMO** by business case; show problems, value
 - 8) Start implementing the <u>OPM3 maturity plan</u>.
