• Have early discussions on how to adjust your course

□ Reduce the local buffer

- Turn the 20-page research paper into 20 one-page papers
- Be transparent about the likelihood to deliver early
 Use fact-based information to drive your forecast



What makes planning agile?

- 1. Agile planning is more focused on the planning than the plan.
- 2. Agile planning encourages change with plans that can be easily changed.
- 3. Agile planning is spread throughout the project.

- Are you more focused on the deliverable or in the planning activities?
- Does it take hours or even days to update your plan due to change?
- Does your process expect all the planning to happen at the beginning?
- Are you setting expectations that precision is replacing accuracy?



Good Agile Planning

Allows leaders to make reliable decisions about their investments.

- Allows us to make accurate predictions, that get more precise as we know more.
- □ Produces plans are easily updated and shared.
- □ Spreads the planning throughout the project.
- Regularly engage in dialog that may adjust the course of the project.



Early Conversations

- Do we bring in more resources to get the work done sooner?
- Can we delay the release until the work is completed?
- Can we deliver what we have by that date and continue to add more?
- Should we cancel/postpone the project altogether?
- How can we reduce the impact of that dependency?
